**A KINGDOM ROOF**

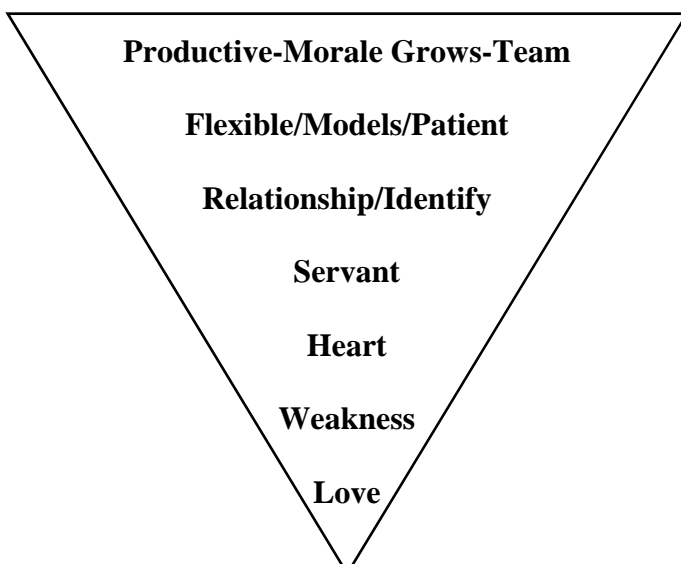
Last Thursday Bing Priest invited me to come and share with his management team at Printing Papers. A few days before I went I asked him what he would like for me to share. He said if you would, discuss how management should happen in view of this message of the kingdom.

As I began to process what to say, I felt God broke it down into two simple pictures of management styles. I put these two pyramids on a white board as follows:

**Kingdom Style**



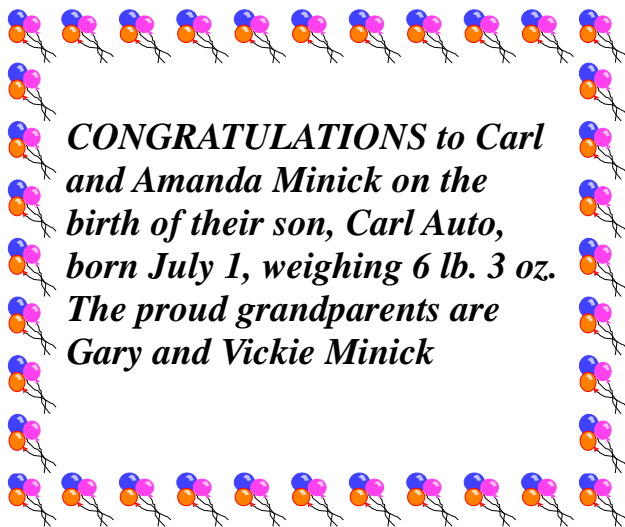
The response was very encouraging and I felt very good about the time. When I opened it up for discus-

sion, one of the ladies on the team made the comment with tears in her eyes, “my daughter is raising her child by the wrong system of fear and she is missing out by not giving her love which would lead to relationship. I want my daughter to understand these pyramids and how it has to do with raising my granddaughter.” One of my final comments was, “would all of us agree Jesus was a good manager of people?” Obviously the answer is yes. How did he lead his management meeting on the last night that was the most important company meeting he had. Rather than with fear proving to them that he was the leader, he took a towel and washed their feet and loved them unconditionally. Therefore, by serving them they bonded with him and they became the power of the first century church. As I left the meeting it became clear to me that this is how life works. Whether it is a grandmother who sees hope of what could change her daughter’s relationship to her granddaughter or by a CEO trying to manage a corporation, a marriage trying to survive, any decision of life would come under this inverted pyramid which Paul the apostle would call the foolishness of this gospel.

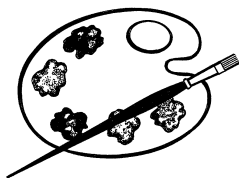
David Wenger and I were talking this week about these two pyramids. He made the comment, “No wonder we have wondered what is the government of this kingdom of David which God says in Isaiah 9:7 ‘of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end.’” I believe that this inverted pyramid represents the government of how the kingdom of God will be covered. It is like a light went on and I became full of gratitude because it is like the whole picture is now here. The beatitudes of Matthew 5 are one bookend. The house built upon the rock and not sand is the other bookend. This kingdom of God’s foundation is the rock on which his kingdom is being built and now the roof of the government will be a pyramid of love on its head, foolish to the world but the power of the kingdom of God which literally has come and will change the world.

Last Sunday was the beginning of the joy and life of the application of how to live and enjoy this house built upon the rock which is our kingdom inheritance. Come and let us continue to apply it together.
